

Journey Dog Team Training Program Assessment Process

Prospective teams are invited to participate in the Journey Dog Team Training Program assessment process, which evaluates both the handler and their canine partner for eligibility. This evaluation aims to understand the unique needs and requirements of each applicant, ensuring the program's suitability. Below is a general overview of the assessment process.

Initial Application

Before initiating the assessment process, applicants must have had a medical evaluation conducted by a regulated health professional. This evaluation is to confirm the need for a trained service dog and to ascertain a qualifying disability, a condition impacting quality of life and/or independence. Subsequently, applicants are requested to submit the JDTTP Application Form, which gathers additional information about the applicant and their service dog prospect. Video Submission & JDTTP Canine Assessment

Following the initial application review, eligible applicants are requested to submit a video featuring the applicant and their service dog prospect in various settings and situations. Detailed filming requirements and guidelines will be provided. Additionally, applicants must complete the JDTTP Canine Assessment, which includes a comprehensive history and behavior questionnaire, along with further information about the service dog prospect.

Note: Service dog prospects demonstrate a friendly, confident, and resilient disposition, showing comfort in various environments without significant anxiety, fear, nervousness, or aggressive behaviors. They must demonstrate good social skills with people and other animals and should not exhibit high prey drive or tendencies for protection, guarding, chasing, or herding. All service dog prospects must be up-to-date on vaccinations as per local regulations and in excellent mental and physical health, as determined by a veterinarian. Additional details on the basic requirements for service dog prospects are available to inquiring applicants.



In-Person Meeting

After reviewing the submitted JDTTP Canine Assessment and video, an in-person meeting, whether conducted live or via Zoom, is scheduled with eligible applicants and their service dog prospects. During this meeting, the Journey Dog team conducts further evaluation of the applicant's eligibility and the service dog prospect's potential suitability for the training program. Specific needs and goals are also discussed to ensure that the JDTTP aligns with the requirements and objectives of each applicant.

Program Acceptance

Before gaining program acceptance, eligible applicants must submit the JDTTP Veterinary Report Form and the JDTTP Medical Recommendation Form, along with the reviewed and signed JDTTP Agreement and the JDTTP Code of Ethics. Following the completion of these steps, qualifying applicants and their service dog prospects will receive an invitation to the Journey Dog Team Training program.

Journey Dog Service and Support Dogs is committed to providing professional training support and guidance to qualifying teams as they navigate the JDTTP curriculum and objectives. Most significantly, the organization prioritizes the development of a mutually beneficial relationship between handlers and their canine partners.
